Summary of events with NM LP

December 22nd: Email was sent by NM LP to notify of a Constitutional Convention

January 6th: Special convention was held to change the rules for delegate requirements

1) It is hereby resolved that Article VII, Paragraph 5(a) of the Constitution of the Libertarian Party of New Mexico is amended to read as follows:

In order to serve as a delegate from LPNM to the National Convention of the Libertarian Party, an individual must be a member of the Executive Committee, a member of the Central Committee, or a caucus member in good standing for 120 days preceding the State Convention at which the delegate is elected to serve at the National Convention. In the case of caucus members, the individual must have also provided 12 hours of volunteer service to LPNM in the 12 months preceding the State Convention. The Secretary shall maintain records of volunteer hours served by caucus members. These requirements may be waived for a particular candidate on a two-thirds vote of the State Convention. The 2022 LPNM Convention shall be prorated to only require 2 hours of volunteer service

January 20th: Party Secretary was emailed questions regarding state party policies (Attch 1)

January 24th: Questions were forwarded to Party Chair and response was received (Attch 2)

January 27th: Caryn Ann Harlos sends a letter to Executive Committee of the Libertarian Party of New Mexico (Attch 3)

January 28th: Response from Vice Chair of NM LP (Attch 4)

January 31st: Rebuttal from Harlos (Attch 5)

February 8th: Tyler Askin, Caryn Ann Harlos, and Chris Luchini discuss the events with the Libertarian National Committee (Attch 6, NM Response 3 FINAL)

March 5th: New Mexico Libertarian Convention

After Reno convention: (Attch 7) Chris Luchini admits that the rules change was not constitutional, but that no one from the Mises caucus wanted to run for that position. What the reader does not know is that on the March 5th convention 5 Mises Caucus members signed up and were disregarded. We all had speeches prepared, but were not allowed to speak.
